### Cancellation Policies

If you are registered, but cannot take part  
for some reason, please notify Alexandra  
Tatum-Nickolay by May 5, 2022 (at the latest).  
Cancellation is free of charge up to eight days  
prior to the opening of our conference. From  
day seven to day five we charge you 50 percent  
of the conference fee. The cancellation fee  
rises to 75 percent from day four to day three.  
On day one and two before the opening of our  
conference we charge you the entire conferen-  
ce fee in case of cancellation or no-show.

### Conference Fee

We kindly ask you to pay the conference regis-

Until autumn 2022, our guesthouse will be

Tutzing is located approximately 35 km southwest of  
Munich on Lake Starnberg (Starnberger See).

From Munich Central Station (Hauptbahnhof): Take  
the urban railway S-6 (S-Bahn) or the regional train  
(RB) to Tutzing. At the train station in Tutzing, take the  
Bus 958/978 to “Klenzestraße”. You will also find  
cabs at the front entrance of Tutzing train station.  
Please note our special offers for conference tickets  
through the Deutsche Bahn (DB) found on our Websi-  
te, see contact “how to find us”.

From the airport take the urban railway S-1 or S-8 to  
Munich Central Station and follow the instructions  
above.

You can also reach the Academy by foot from Tutzing  
train station. It takes you 20 to 30 minutes.

To reach the Academy by car, take freeway A95 from  
Munich via A952 to Starnberg and continue on the  
federal highway until you pass the town of Traubing,  
then take a left. At the end of the road turn right to  
Tutzing. The Academy is on your left shortly after  
passing the town sign Tutzing.

the Academy for E-vehicles (cars, scooters, bikes)  
free of charge.

INVITATION

Since World War II and the Holocaust, antisemitic acts and attitudes are rather considered as intolerable in the Western world. Nevertheless, many European Jews in particular are noticing a clear increase of antisemitism during recent years and are more and more unsettled. Anti-Jewish prejudices are proving to be persistent even in circles of higher education. In addition to latent prejudices and stereotypes in public discourse, there is still an unresolved tension and “grey area” between criticism of Israeli politics and Israel-related anti-Semitism.

Latent antisemitism is also presenting itself in the context of new conspiracy myths, that are (co-)supported by current protest movements against corona preventive measures. Empirical research is still in its beginning, and a comprehensive definition of latent antisemitism is still lacking. This is where the conference “Latent Antisemitism: Forms of Expressions – Perceptibility – Counterstrategies” comes in. Experts of several disciplines from Germany and abroad come together and engage in direct exchange.
